Weekly Progress (22nd February - 1st March)

We have now given a total of **198,700** vaccines across our Health Board area. **By the end of today we will have administered over 200,000 vaccines** (a combination of 1st and 2nd doses). This incredible figure comes just 24 days after reaching our total of 100,000 vaccines being given.

We have now vaccinated 89.9% of Group 5, those aged 65-69 years. 22,548 have now received their second dose of vaccine.

GPs are currently vaccinating eligible individuals within priority Group 6 and have currently vaccinated 18,612 people. This Group includes adults aged 16 years to 64 years with underlying health conditions which put them at higher risk of serious disease and mortality and relevant unpaid carers.

Revised JCVI national guidance describes relevant unpaid carers as:

"Those who are eligible for a carer's allowance, or those who are the sole or primary carer of an elderly or disabled person who is at increased risk of COVID-19 mortality and therefore **clinically vulnerable**. Those clinically vulnerable to COVID include children with severe neurodisabilities, those who are designated Clinically Extremely Vulnerable (Shielding), adults who have underlying health conditions and those who need care because of advanced age. Eligible carers should be vaccinated in priority group 6."

Welsh Government issued guidance on 24 February 2021 stating which groups of unpaid carers should be prioritised for vaccination. There are three important factors to consider below:

- I. The vulnerability of the person being cared for
 - Is 65 years and over (group 5)
 - Is deemed extremely clinically vulnerable (group 4)
 - Has underlying health condition (group 6)
 - Is a child under 16 with complex medical needs/severe neuro-disabilities
- II. The nature of the care provided to those 16 and over
- III. The unpaid carer is the sole or primary carer

Housebound Patients

The Health Board is continuing to vaccinate people who are housebound and the vast majority of these patients have already received a vaccine.

We are deploying teams of District Nurses, GPs, and mobile units to roll-out the vaccine to those that are housebound and eligible in line with the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) priority groups 1-6.

Housebound patients will be contacted before they are due to be vaccinated so they know when to expect a visit from the team.

What to expect when having your vaccination

You will receive information about when and where to get vaccinated. On the day of your appointment, wear practical clothing so it's easy to access your upper arm. If you have a fear of needles or feel anxious, let the person giving you your vaccine know. They will be understanding and can support you. It is important to have both doses of the vaccine to give you the best longer-term protection. Keep your vaccine card safe and make sure you take it to your second dose appointment.
